DRESS CODE

The United Service Club Queensland offers a comfortable and stylish atmosphere suitable for formal, professional and social occasions. Members and their guests are asked to adhere to the Dress Code.

In all areas of the Club, Professional Dress is required.

Professional Dress

- Suit, skirt, dress or tailored trousers
- Collared long or short sleeve button through shirt
- Polo shirt
- Business shoes
- Coat and tie optional

Members Dining Room Dress

Lunch – Collared long or short sleeve button through shirt Dinner – Collared long or short sleeve button through shirt with coat (tie is optional, but encouraged)

Events Dress

Should an event require specific dress code, such details will be included in the event invitation.

Formal National Dress and Service Uniform

Formal national dress and service uniform may be worn at any time in the Club.

Friday, Weekend and Terrace Dress

Dress jeans may be worn on Fridays and weekends and tailored shorts may be worn on the terrace at any time.

Unacceptable Attire

- Collarless shirts
- Clothing with offensive logos
- Active wear including sports shorts and tracksuits
- Recreational or untidy footwear
- Unkempt clothing of any description

Guest Check-in

Reciprocal members and guests who are travelling are requested to wear tidy casual clothes as a minimum on arrival. Guests should make their way to Reception upon arrival.

Children

Children are very welcome at the Club. Parents are asked to ensure children are accompanied by an adult and are appropriately dressed.
